SWAP SHOP 2018 - Timeline

20 th February	Swap Shop online registration opens

1. All London Foundation Schools offers a Swap Shop for doctors who wish to arrange to swap their provisionally allocated F2 programme with another doctor within the foundation school.

FOUNDATION YEARS TRAINING ON MEDICAL ETHICS AND LAW (MEL)

The Institute of Medical Ethics (IME) wants to understand the Medical Ethics and Law (MEL) training needs of Foundation Year (FY) doctors.

In order to achieve this, a survey has been designed based upon existing and upcoming IME Core Curriculums, the British Medical Association (BMA) Handbook, and the General Medical Council (GMC) Generic Professional Capabilities, and with key stakeholders such as the UK Foundation Programme Directors, and Health Education England. The survey contains questions about the MEL training during medical school and as a FY Doctor.

The survey has been deemed a service development. Ethical approval has been granted by Faculty of Health and Medicine Research Ethics Committee (FHM REC), Lancaster University. Please contact Professor Roger Pickup, Chair of FHM REC, if you wish to speak to someone outside of the survey team (r.pickup@lancaster.ac.uk). Research governance approval has been granted by HEE.

The e-learning sessions in these Professional Capabilities explore the relationship between doctors and their patients and how to deliver effective patient centered care.

'Handling Complaints' provides essential information about common factors leading to complaints, how to minimize these, the procedures involved and what your responsibilities are as a foundation doctor.

The Mental Capacity Act (MCA) protects the right of vulnerable people and this group of sessions cover topics such as assessing capacity, consent, patient autonomy and safeguarding. You will also consider the multidisciplinary team (MDT) approach to healthcare in the hospital and patient support after discharge.
