WHEN

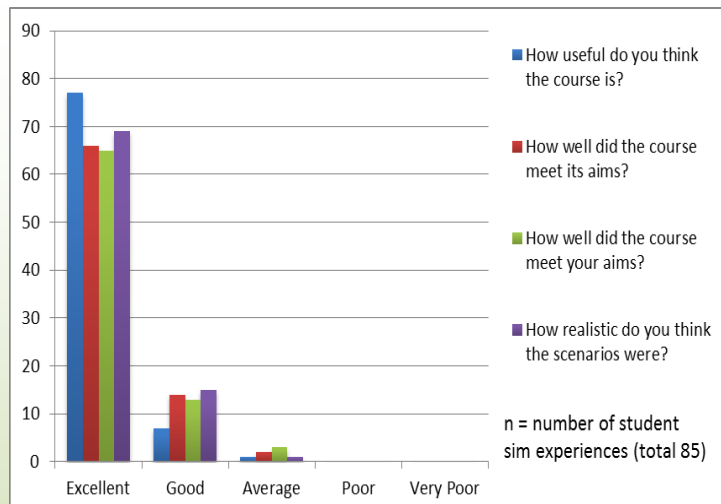
- Every Tuesday morning dedicated Simulation-based teaching session, tailored to the students' rotation

WHAT

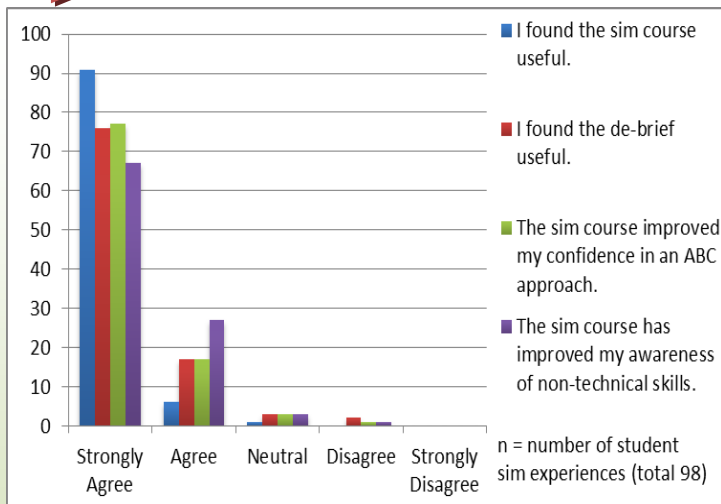
- High-fidelity simulation model, with part-time simulation faculty team
- Typical scenarios include:
 - Acute breathlessness, chest pain (Med)
 - Antepartum, Postpartum bleeding (O&G)
 - Wheeze, Fever (Paediatrics)

THE FUTURE
